THE HISTORY OF MIDWEST ELITE BASKETBALL

Brad Schmit

Craig Doty is the head coach at Emporia State University and Brad Schmit is the head coach at Central Wyoming College. Back in the summer of 2006, Doty wanted to run some basketball camps for high school teams for his summer job. Doty discussed his idea with his college teammate, Brad Schmit, who had just finished his legendary playing career at Morningside University where he still ranks as the all-time leading scorer. Brad said he was interested and together they moved the idea forward.

Doty and Schmit created brochures and wrote a cover letter, printed them at the college, tri-folded them, sealed them in an envelope and sent them to a few hundred schools in the Midwest. Coach Greg Pavlik at Osmond High School in Nebraska and Coach Travis Hensch at Wadena Deer Creek in Minnesota responded to the mailers in 2006 and booked camps. Midwest Elite Basketball, affectionately know as "MEB," was officially started.

Over the coming summers, Doty and Schmit would build a staff of over 70 college coaches who would travel the Midwest to run our patented Satellite Camps. From two camps in 2006, to 70 camps in 2011, to 175 camps in 2019, MEB took off while expanding into 18 different states.

The difference between MEB and other camps was simple. We came to you, whereas the other camps didn't. This model allowed MEB to cut the travel expenses, improve entire teams, and build relationships with the high school coaches while customizing each camp specifically for each team.

MEB enters year 19 of operation this summer and looks forward to bringing our staff of college coaches and players to your gym to work with you and your program. See you soon!
